

The Alderton Infant School
PE and School Sport Premium Statement 2014-15

The government is providing funding of £150 million per annum for academic years 2013-14 and 2014-15 to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sport provision. Schools are free to determine how best to use this funding, including increasing participation in PE and sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of. Ofsted assess and report on how effectively the funding is being used to improve the quality of PE and sport provision when making the judgement on the quality of the schools leadership and management.

For 2014-15 The Alderton Infant School received £8,720

Our aims are:

- To appreciate and value the best efforts of every child in all aspects of school life, ensuring they each realise their maximum potential.
- To provide a broad, balanced, stimulating curriculum for every child regardless of race, gender and ability.
- To create a happy caring community where all feel valued and secure

Outcome:

All children will have access to high quality PE and school sport.

Effective uses of funding:

1. Employing specialist coaches to work alongside teachers in lessons to increase their subject knowledge and confidence in PE. (£5,225 per annum)

<i>We work in collaboration with Tottenham Hotspurs to employ a multi-skills coach to deliver sessions with all year groups each Thursday. The children benefit from being taught by a qualified coach and our own Teaching Assistants (some of whom are also Midday Assistants) are developed through sharing good practice and assisting in lessons.</i>
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2. Buying into existing local sports networks such as school sport partnerships and initiatives. (£1,200 per annum)
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<i>We are proud to be a part of the longstanding West Essex School Sports Partnership, which offers competitions, school-to-school support, professional development, data monitoring, co-ordination of local strategy and access to resources. Our Deputy Headteacher attends regular partnership meetings and liaises regarding local KS1 inter-school events. We are also paying for transport, so that pupils can attend an increased number of inter-school sporting events.</i>

3. Providing extra, additional activities. (£3,135 per annum)
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<i>This academic year we are employing a tennis coach to work with each class for tennis lessons. Our Teachers will be developed through sharing good practice and assisting in lessons. We have purchased 30 rackets and balls to ensure tennis is sustainable.</i>
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4. Purchasing specialist equipment and teaching resources to develop a non-traditional activity and introducing new initiatives such as basic movement skills (From PPG budget)
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<i>Two TAs lead early morning, Gym Trail sessions for groups of identified children. The aim is to improve fine and gross motor skills, while having fun through activity. A range of resources has been purchased and the staff have been trained to deliver the sessions.</i>

Paying for professional development opportunities for staff in PE and sport (From CPD budget)</p> <p><i>While the Deputy Headteacher is subject leader for PE and sport, she is also responsible for leading and coordinating professional development across the school. The School Development Plan is a comprehensive document, including PE and Sport, which drives the school forward by identifying key areas for development and new opportunities. Courses attended by staff are reported on a termly basis to the Governing Body.</i></p> <p>IMPACT: 22.5.14 Tees cricket coaching for all Yr 2 children led by staff from Davenant 16.6.14 12 Yr 2 children visit to Spurs training ground (selection based on sporting attitude)</p>
<p>7. Providing further dance opportunities (from School Fund)</p> <p><i>Following the success of dance lessons for every class last year, we plan to welcome back our dance tutor to lead workshops for all children in the summer term. The finale will be another “Sponsored Bop” for parents in June 2015.</i></p>
<p>8. Providing places for pupils in after school sports clubs. (Currently eligible children funded from PPG budget)</p> <p><i>Every child has the opportunity to participate in a range of PE and sporting activities. We are proud of our Healthy School status. We engage a football coach from Tottenham Hotspurs and a dance tutor from Epping Forest Dance to lead after school clubs. They are popular, over-subscribed clubs.</i></p> <p>IMPACT: Summer 2014 – Pop and Bop – 16 children (10 x Yr 2, 6 x Yr 1) Football – 16 children (5 x Yr1, 11 x Yr 2)</p>

Actual expenditure at least £9,560 plus other funding streams.

Review
